### **Before you fly**

Before you leave to the airport, please remember to take the following documents with you:

- ✓ Valid passport
- ✓ South Africa Visa (if applicable)
- ✓ Yellow fever certificate (You will be denied entry if you don't have one)
- ✓ E Ticket
- ✓ Official invitation letter
- ✓ Accommodation booking confirmation.
- ✓ Travel insurance
- ✓ Some cash/Visa or MasterCard's

### **Travelling to South Africa**

Flights to South Africa arrive at OR Tambo International Airport. If you have any difficulty while travelling, please contact your airline company, or Sonke Gender Justice: + 27 (0) 11 339 3589

Please, remember to do the online check-in prior to your flight, or allow enough time to do so at your departure airport.

Participants are asked to ensure that they arrive on time at the airport on time so that they do not miss their flight. Please ensure that you arrive at the airport three hours + before your departure time. Any necessary changes due to missing a flight are the responsibility of the participant.

#### Transport to and from the airport

Sonke Gender Justice has organized a shuttle service between the airport and the Hotel for participants sponsored by Sonke. Participants who are self sponsored or sponsored by other organizations must inform us of their arrival time so we can liaise with the hotel to ease their pick up.

A member of the Hotel/shuttle services will be waiting for you at the arrival terminal of the airport with a Sonke\_Gender\_Justice\_sign and will drive you to the hotel. Please only use the provided shuttle. For Sonke sponsored participants please do not use any other private taxi, if you do, this will be at your own cost. In case you do not find the Shuttle person upon arriving the airport, please contact the service provider on WhatsApp Joy Dlamini (who will already be in Johannesburg) on +27 73 5524 100. When leaving the hotel back to your home country, a shuttle service to the airport will be available from the hotel 3 hours prior to your flight departure.

Please, make sure to notify any change on your flight (delays or cancellations) to the Hotel/ Shuttle Services or to Joy & Jude.

#### Accommodation

Accommodation is booked at the Birchwood Hotel & OR Tambo Conference Center Johannesburg. Payment has already been made for Sonke Sponsored participants, however self-sponsored participants need to make prior arrangements with the hotel. When you arrive at the hotel, please check in at the reception. For sponsored participants, any extras will be paid by themselves.

#### Weather

#### **Time differences:**

The time zone in South Africa is Central Africa Time(**CAT**) (GMT+2)

#### Electricity

All power **sockets in South Africa** provide a standard **voltage** of 230V with a standard frequency of 50Hz. Electricity sockets are type mostly type **M** but type **C**, **D** and **N** are common



#### Currency

Currency: The local currency is the South Africa Rand. For currency conversions please refer to this website for more information: <u>https://www1.oanda.com/currency/converter/</u> **Alternatively, you can travel with your Visa or Master Cards which are accepted everywhere of course taking extra precaution as usual.** 

#### Meals

- **Breakfast**: a breakfast buffet will be available at the hotel from 6.00am 10.30am.
- **Lunch:** Lunches and coffee breaks will be part of the Workshop organized by Sonke and will be served at the meeting venue.
- Dinner: Participants are responsible for arranging their dinners, where these are not part of the official programme. Sonke will provide participants who are sponsored with an allowance to cover these costs. Those who are self-sponsored need to provide their own meals.

#### **Immunization Requirements**

Travelers entering South Africa from countries where yellow fever is endemic are required to present their Yellow World Health Organisation (WHO) Card or other proof or vaccination.

#### **Information Pack**

- Each participant will be provided with an Information Pack, which will include the Agenda and concept note for the Consultation, notebook, pen and social media guide.
- Registration will begin at 7:30 am on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2023.

#### **Toiletries**

Do not forget to bring all standard toiletry items. If you wear contact lens, you should bring all the supplies needed. We also recommend that you bring vitamins and any medications/supplies you need (cold medication, antacids, aspirin, insect repellant, razors, tissues, and personal hygiene items).

#### **Sickness or Accident**

In case of sickness or accident during the Conference the delegates should immediately notify a member of the Organizing Committee. Delegates are advised to ensure that they have adequate insurance coverage, either at their own expense or at the expense of their nominating organisation, for sickness, accident, temporary disability, death and third party risk covering the entire duration of the conference and the journey to and from the Conference venue.

#### **Security Situation**

The security situation in South Africa is calm. Terrorism is a global concern; however, there is NO direct threat in South Africa. It is the traveler's responsibility to comply with immigration, customs and health requirements while entering/exiting the country.

#### Reimbursements


